ASHBURTON INTERMEDIATE (#3282)

Enrolment Scheme Description

Effective from Term 1, 2022

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Starting from the intersection of Walnut Avenue and West Street (SH1)

- South West along West Street (SH1) to East Street (SH1)
 - Including West Street between Moore Street and Kermode Street
- South West along East Street (SH1) to the south bank of the Ashburton River
- North West along the south west bank of the Ashburton River to the confluence of the Ashburton River South Branch with the Ashburton River North Branch
- West (across country) to the northern end of Hollands Road
- South west (across country) to address 322 Tinwald Westerfield Mayfield Road
- North West along Tinwald Westerfield Mayfield Road to Remingtons Road
 - Including Tinwald Westerfield Mayfield Road between Remingtons Road and Millars Road
 - Including Millars Road
- South along Remingtons Road to Frasers Road
- West along Frasers Road to Ferrimans Road
- South West along Ferrimans Road to Maronan Road
 - Including Plantation Road
- East along Maronan Road to Lovetts Road
- South along Lovetts Road to Hendersons Road,
- North East along Hendersons Road to Lills Road
- North East (across the railway line) to the intersection of Longbeach Road and Hinds Highway (SH1)
- North East along both sides of Hinds Highway (SH 1) to Hassal Street
 - Including Laings Road
- South along Hassal Street to Fords Road
- South along Fords Road to Boundary Road
- North East along Boundary Road to Stranges Road
- South East along Stranges Road to Grahams Road
- South along Grahams Road to Maginness Road
- East along Maginness Road to Stranges Road
- Due East (across Lake Hood) to the Ashburton River
- North along the west bank of the Ashburton River to the Boundary Road river access
- East (across the Ashburton River) to the western end of Nicolls Road
- North East along Nicolls Road to Wakanui Road

- South East along Wakanui Road to Stanley Road
- North East along Stanley Road to Singletree Road
- East along Singletree Road to Winters Road
- South East along Winters Road to Christys Road
- North East along Christys Road to Pendarves Rakaia Road
- North along Pendarves Rakaia Road to Gardiners Road
- North East along Gardiners Road to Mainwarings Road
- North West along Mainwarings Road to Pendarves Rakaia Road
- North East along Pendarves Rakaia Road to Hatfield Overdale Road
- North West along Hatfield Overdale Road to Thompsons Track
- West along Thompsons Track to Mitcham Road
- South West along Mitcham Road to Dromore Methven Road
- North West along Dromore Methven Road to Winchmore Lauriston Road
- South West along Winchmore Lauriston Road to the Methven Highway
- North West along the Methven Highway to Shearers Road
- South West along Shearers Road, across the North Branch of the Ashburton River to Walkhams Road
- South West along Walkhams Road to the north bank of the South Branch of the Ashburton River
- South East along the north bank of the South Branch of the Ashburton River to the confluence of the Ashburton River South Branch with the Ashburton River North Branch and Melrose Road
- East along Melrose Road to Alford Forest Road (SH 77)
- South along Alford Forest Road (SH 77) to Oak Grove
- North East along the north side only of Oak Grove to Walnut Avenue
- South East along Walnut Avenue to West Street (SH 1)

Addresses on both sides of boundary roads are considered in-zone unless specified otherwise.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First Priority** is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
- Second Priority must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

- Third Priority must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- Fourth Priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth Priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- Sixth Priority must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary, under Section 11G (1) on the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
